She was removed to that place after a desperate attempt to kill a nurse belonging to the infirmary, whom she almost succeeded in throttling.



14 LOST IN GREAT GALE.

Swept from Vessels Which Wind Had Driven Ashore.

NINE DROWNED TOGETHER.

Crews of the Barges Wilmore and Grant Blown Overboard Off Chedwick.

Later reports to-day show that probably fourteen persons lost their lives during the gale which swept the coast in the vicinity of New York Saturday night and Sunday.

The greatest single disaster was the drowning of nine men from the barges Wilmore and Grant, which went ashore at Chedwick, N. J., a mile and a half south of Long Branch.

200 LOST IN WRECK?

Fears that Vessel Plying to Manila May Have Sunk.

MANILA, Nov. 25.—The local steamer Alberta, with 20 passengers, including some discharged American soldiers from Olongapo, Subic Bay to Manila, is believed to have been lost.

Olongapo is about eighty miles from Manila by water.
