RACE TRACK NEW ORLEANS, Dec. 9.—A good old-fashioned rain storm spoiled this place last night and as it kept up for several hours it spoiled all chances of good racing being seen this afternoon. It changed the track to heavy but it changed conditions to the contrary. It was like summer weather before the rain came up yesterday and today it was cold and cloudy.

The heavy track caused numerous scratches in the different races. In the fourth race, which was the main event, being a handicap, was so many scratches that it had to be declared off and a new one substituted it being a 1-2 furlong with twelve entries.


MAHER THE BEST JOCKEY.
