constructing scenery, and Samuel Friedmann, one of McDonald's employees. The Department of Buildings had been complaining recently concerning the stage of the Grand, saying that McDonald had had it packed with highly inflammable material, all in violation of the building laws. After a number of complaints, the department threatened Springer with prosecution unless the matter was corrected.

Springer went to the theatre to-day and in his endeavor to have McDonald clear away the objectionable stuff a fight was started, in which, it is said, Mr. Springer was forcibly ejected from the theatre, of which he is the lessee, by McDonald and his six employees.

Mr. Springer found a policeman, and the arrested McDonald and Friedmann and took them to the Jefferson Market Court.

McDonald was arraigned in Jefferson Market Court before Magistrate Corbett, who promptly decided that the case was one for civil action and discharged McDonald.
