ASSASSIN TRIES TO KILL SULTAN.

Guards Overpower Bulgarian Patriot, Who Obtained Entrance to Palace Disguised as Official to Carry Out Bold Plot.

BERLIN, Oct. 22.—The Tageblatt publishes to-day a despatch from Constantinople which states that an attempt has been made to assassinate the Sultan.

The despatch says that a Bulgarian disguised as a palace official tried to kill Abdul Hamid, but that the guards were alert and overpowered the would-be assassin before he could harm the Sultan.

Abdul Hamid II, Sultan of Turkey, known as the "Sick Man of Europe," and recorded in diplomatic circles as the monarch who endeavors to use all Europe for the furtherance of his own interests and ambitions, is one of the most interesting personages in the international history of the present day.

This famous Mussulman, head of the Ottoman Empire and Guardian of the Dardanelles, was born sixty years ago this month.

The present is not the first time that he has been the object of an assassin's plot, several attempts having been made in recent years to cut short his career of luxury, so that with all his income of ten millions of dollars a year, the finest stable of thoroughbreds in the world, a harem and unlimited ease, he is said to be in constant fear of death by plotters.

Healers Held Culpable.

"To exclude the material senses. 'Did you take up the life thought?' 'There is no such thing in our belief.' 'Do you believe if a person was high enough in Christian Science that he could throw away all materiality, that what we call the soul could be returned to the body by that sublime faith?' 'We don't think of the soul. That is, we don't think God is in the body.' 'The Coroner at 115 rendered this verdict: 'That Esther Hunter, Quimby came to her death in the village of White Plains on Oct. 20, 1902, of diphtheria and general septicemia, owing to the culpable neglect of her parents, John Quimby and Georgiana Quimby, also a certain so-called Christian Science healer named John Carroll Lathrop, in failing to provide medical care and treatment. The evidence, therefore, warrants the holding of these persons under the penal code on the charge of manslaughter.' 'ARCHIBALD T. BANNING.

The reading of the verdict holding the parents of the child and healer on the charge of manslaughter for allowing Esther to die without a physician caused a flutter of excitement.

'Is real food really necessary to sustain life in the real body?' 'Real food to the spiritual is spiritual food to the body.' 'Now then, food is not in a spiritual sense necessary for the real body. Could a man live without food if he was high in Christian Science?' 'He probably could if he was spiritually high enough, although it would be needed in some material form.' 'To what would you ascribe Esther's death?' 'Nothing from a Christian Science point of view. It was real in your sense.' 'In giving your treatment to Esther, did you sit by her bedside?' 'I sat the treatment described. We consider the Lord is all around us and not above. I used as high realization of the power of God as possible.' 'Did you tell her to get rid of her claim?' 'I didn't do anything; I said nothing audibly.' 'Were your eyes shut?'

ANOTHER GREAT STRIKE IS LIKELY.

Stationary Engineers May Be Ordered to Refuse to Handle Non-Union Coal.

CHICAGO, Oct. 22.—President Morton of the International Association of Stationary Engineers and Firemen, stated to-day that all members of the association all over the country would be ordered to refuse to handle any anthracite coal until every member affected by the anthracite strike is reinstated on the basis on which the miners returned to work.

This action has been called forth by the fact that advices from several of the mines to-day showed that there was a disposition to keep non-union men at work in preference to union hands.

President Morton said: "While negotiations looking toward a settlement were on we did not wish to interfere in any way, although we feared our men would get the worst of the bargain. We have supported the miners in every manner during the strike and believe the action of the dressers and engineers in quitting work helped materially to win the fight."

"I will advocate that our members be ordered to refuse to handle anthracite coal, and, as to my mind this is the only method that will bring the operators to time, I believe the board will adopt my suggestion."
