

"LYNCH HIM!" CRIED CROWD.

Hundreds of Angry Men in Brooklyn Streets Tried to Get at Negro Assailant of Miss Stafford.

POLICE FOUGHT THEM BACK.

With Two Alleged Accomplices He Was Taken to Jail To-Day in a Van, Through the Threatening Yell of Crowd.

POLICE FOUGHT THEM BACK.

Threatening to lynch Isaac Williams, the negro who is accused of assaulting Miss Phoebe Stafford, of No. 235 Sheffield avenue, Brooklyn, a few nights ago, three hundred angry citizens surrounded the van in which he was being taken to jail to-day. But for the efforts of a platoon of police the man might have been at least severely hurt.
