Met Bride While Cruising. Elliott Fitch Shepard, jr., has been the cause of a number of severe social convulsions since attaining his majority. Six years ago, while living with his mother in their Newport house, the young man was in the habit of sailing about the end of Long Island in his yacht. It was observed that his favorite stopping place was at Greenport.

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Reconciliation Felt Through. A year ago there was some talk of reconciling young Mrs. Shepard. She proved herself about the suspicions of the family.

Difficulties Patched Up. When young Mrs. Shepard went to Paris, after her divorce proceedings were discontinued, she went to a hotel near the one in which her husband was living.
