

WHERE THE GANGS ARE AGAIN BECOMING ACTIVE ON CHERRY HILL, AND SOME TYPES OF THOSE WHO FIGURE AS LEADERS.

Lawlessness in This City was Never So Rampant—Forty Duels with Knives and Pistols in a Week.

POLICE CAN'T COPE WITH IT.

Fond of Old Cherryites Revived by a New Generation Led by "Monk" Eastman and "Bill" Sanger, and Life on the Hill is Held Cheaply.

Cherry Hill to-day is worse than an isolated mining camp of Arizona, invaded by drunken cowboys bent on shooting up the town. So far no one has been killed by this latest outbreak.

Not since the days of the Whyo Gang, the Bend of the Sixth Ward, the Hell's Kitchen Gang, the Dead Rabbits, the Robber Shoe and the Battle Row gangs has there been so much lawlessness in any one section of the city.

Nothing but a sensational murder can break up the Cherry Hill Gang. Day after day the gang does a job, and is careful are they not to catch on even an enemy that they usually go free, as was shown to-day in a police court.

Two men emptied revolvers at each other. Policeman Mulholl got to the spot just as the shooting started. Both men threw away their revolvers.

"Who's shooting?" he asked excitedly.

"There he goes, officer," the two cried. "He's just run around to James Slip."

"The policeman knew differently. He arrested both. When arrested, the magistrate asked the policeman if he had seen the men shoot.

"No," he replied, "but I know they did the shooting."

"Discharged," the magistrate said.

From this it will be seen how difficult it is for the police to cope with the gang. Every time one of their number is let go they become bolder and openly defy the policeman who made the arrest.

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COMPANY'S SIDE OF BRIDGE STRIKE

Says Union Was Precipitate and Ordered Men Out While President Was Ill and Unable to Meet Them.

In a statement given out to-day by the American Bridge Company, many of the assertions made by President Buchanan, of the International Union of Bridge and Structural Ironworkers, were branded as untrue.

"In regard to the statement that Buchanan sought an interview with the American Bridge Company," says the company, "he called up on the telephone and was advised that the President was at that time sick in bed, but was expected to be at the office in a few days, when he would see him.

In reply to the claim of President Buchanan that if the cost of erecting work is greater now than formerly it is because of bad management, the Bridge Company says:

"According to our records, the cost of performing erecting work has increased from 20 per cent. to 300 per cent. in the last three years, the wages have increased during that time nearly 100 per cent. and the efficiency of the men has greatly decreased."

Regarding the statement as to the putting on of laborers in Buffalo, the company says that "by the understanding we had with the Buffalo union, we could work one laborer to every seven bridge men.

The unions have been trying to force the employers to employ only union foremen. On account of the foremen being the employer's direct representatives on the work, this would place the matter entirely in the hands of the union and the employers would have no representation whatever.
