

WOMAN FIGHTS A HIGHWAYMAN.

She Struggles with Him Desperately in a Lonely Street Till Her Husband Comes to Her Rescue.

ASSAILANT IN UNIFORM.

Woman Says He Wore that of Street Car Conductor and the Police Took Man Up on Suspicion—He Denies He Was the Highwayman.

Mrs. M. Clark, who lives in East Twelfth street, Yale Park, L. I., was saved from the attack of a highwayman early today by her husband, who was a little late in meeting her at the car.

The case was reported to the police of the Sheepshead Bay station, Mrs. Clark telling them that her assailant wore the uniform of a street-car conductor, a black overcoat and a black derby hat.

Later in the morning Policeman Thomas Dempsey arrested Hugh Mahoney, of Parkville, on suspicion. He is a conductor on the Van Brunt street line and denies that he was in the vicinity at the time of the hold-up.

Mrs. Clark was at the home of friends in Brooklyn and told her husband she would be home about 4.30 o'clock.


