

WON'T RETURN FROM THIS CALL

Willie McBride, Favorite Wall Street District Messenger Boy, Drops Dead While on His Way Home in Brooklyn.

JUST WORE HIMSELF OUT.

Was Known for His Energy, and His Frail Physique Was Unable to Stand the Strain of the Strenuous Life.

All day a procession of boys of all ages and sizes, wearing the uniform of the American District Messenger Company, filed into the little frame house at No. 18 Fourteenth street, Brooklyn, to take the last look at their former comrade, William McBride, whose frail little form lay stretched in a simple pine coffin.

William was not the fabled messenger boy of the humorist. In fact, he was known in the Wall street district as "Willie the Sprinter" for the candy store and another Wall street messenger knew William McBride well and often tipped him liberally for his unusually energy. The doctors say his remarkable nervous energy that compelled him to be ever on the run completely exhausted his frail physique and caused him to fall dead at the feet of his companions in front of a little candy store in Hamilton avenue last evening.

SHOT HIMSELF AT WIFE'S SIDE

Aroused by Pistol Report, Mrs. Michael J. Titus Found Her Husband in a Dying Condition in Bed.

Michael J. Titus, a conductor on the New York, New Haven and Hartford Railroad, shot himself in the head early today while his wife was asleep by his side in bed at their home, No. 533 East One Hundred and Thirty-sixth street. Titus died an hour later in Lincoln Hospital.

He was forty years old and had been with the railroad company sixteen years, the last thirteen of which he had been a conductor. Until two years ago he had been industrious and home-loving, spending all his spare time with his six daughters, the oldest of whom was Lillian, eighteen years old, and the youngest a child of three.

Two years since he became fascinated by the race horses, neglected his home to go to the race tracks, lost his earnings and drank heavily. Many quarrels resulted from his excessive drinking and in one of them last Christmas he is said to have tried to shoot his wife.

When he came to New York he found as his assistant James Stokes, brother of the young woman who is to be his bride. The Stokes family has always been interested in the social condition of the poor, and it was at the solicitation of the Society that James took a position in the settlement so that he could direct the charity work of the Stokes family.

Mr. Stokes took a liking to his young superior, and last July invited Mr. Hunter to the Stokes summer home on Birch Island, in the lower Lewisville Lake, in the Adirondacks. There Mr. Hunter met Miss Caroline Phelps Stokes, and during his vacation the friends of the young couple believe that the acquaintance soon ripened into a courtship.

Any way, during the following months Mr. Hunter was a frequent caller at the Madison avenue home of the heiress and was one of a party of invited guests to accompany Miss Stokes in her private car on a tour of the Grand Canyon in Arizona. The trip ended April 8, and it is believed that the engagement dates from that trip.

Following the example of her brother, James G. Phelps Stokes, Miss Stokes after her marriage will reside in the east side, in the midst of her life work.

"It is not definitely decided yet just where I will live," she said to an Evening World reporter today, "but I will not in the University Settlement building. Mr. Hunter and I will live near by. Our wedding will take place at our country place, Island Farm, Fairfield, Conn."

The father of the bride-to-be is said to be worth more than \$50,000,000. When his other daughters were married he gave each \$1,000,000, and Miss Stokes's friends predict the same for her. Then her share in the immense estate will eventually amount to many millions more.

Miss Caroline Phelps Stokes has been known in philanthropic work since 1880, she being several years older than Mr. Hunter, who is twenty-seven. In 1884 she was considerably angered because Ansonia, Conn., closed a library she had given it in memory of her grandfather, Anson G. Phelps, the famous financier. Ansonia was named after him. Later she moved the library to Derby, where streets were named after her and her sister, Olivia.

She and her sister gave Yale a \$100,000 administration building in 1899 and last year offered to sell to the city of New York for \$100,000 less than appraised value the old Stokes homestead property at No. 25 Madison avenue, but the offer was refused, as the property was too expensive for municipal purposes. It would have come to about \$433,000.

Miss Caroline Phelps Stokes does not wear feathers in her millinery. She gave the Zoological Society \$3,000 for the protecting of birds. She has also been a generous contributor to the deserving poor.
