

LONGEST LINER BREAKS RECORD.

New Kaiser Wilhelm II. Crosses the Atlantic from Cherbourg to Nantucket in a Little More than Four Days.

FIVE DAYS TO SANDY HOOK?

Experts Confident that the Latest Flyer, Built Under the Kaiser's Watchful Eye, Will Surpass All Other Ocean Greyhounds in Speed.

From Cherbourg to Nantucket in four days eight hours and forty minutes is the record already achieved by the Kaiser Wilhelm II., the North German Lloyd's new queen of the seas, due in port to-day on her maiden voyage from Bremen.

Though heralded as the coming five-day transatlantic liner, she is not being pushed for a record on her first trip. The first passage will rather be a try-out for her boilers, which are having their first test in deep-sea going.

The vessel will hardly reach Sandy Hook before sundown, making the time of her passage above five days and twenty-three hours. This will be a record for a maiden voyage, though it does not equal the best time between Cherbourg and New York.

She sailed from Bremen April 14, Southampton April 15 and left Cherbourg at 1 A. M. on April 18. Cape Hogeman is in command.

Germany Proud of Her. Germany takes immense pride in the new liner which American eyes will see for the first time to-day. At her launching, it was declared, she typified a new epoch in naval architecture. She was built for speed, luxury and service in time of war. She was built under the eye of the Kaiser and several times at the suggestion of his naval experts.

Her speed in changes in her plans. The crew has been drilled so that in twelve hours the ship can be altered into a fully equipped armored cruiser.

That is only one of the marvels of her construction. She is 706 feet in length, making her the longest liner afloat. Her engines have a capacity of 40,000 horse-power. Her coal bunker is 25,000 tons, making her practically a five-day boat between Plymouth and Sandy Hook. She has eight decks and accommodations for 775 saloon passengers, 24 second-class and 170 steerage passengers. The crew consists of 600 all told, making a total of 1,375 for whom accommodations are provided.

Some New Features.

A new feature of this express liner is the installation of what are known as "imperial suits," "luxury apartments" and "state cabins." The "imperial" suits consist of a breakfast room, drawing room and bedroom, with connecting bath. The "luxury" apartments are a single magnificent, and the "state" cabins consist of suits of two rooms and bath. There are for general accommodation a smoking room, drawing room, literary room, sewing room, children's playroom and two Viennese cafes. The electric system is most elaborate.

Telephones are everywhere, and one may call up his stateroom from any part of the ship. In the saloon cabins are electric heaters, cigar-lighters and hair-curlers. The vessel, besides, boasts of a complete post-office, where the mail can be sorted during the voyage.

Richard Croker Took Second Money with His Horse.



BRADY BESTS KENNEDY AT LAW.

SAYS HE HAS VOTES TO DO IT.

Frawley, who early in the session introduced a bill to revive boxing exhibitions in this State, has not yet given up hope of passing his bill.
