AL ADAMS TO GO TO DANNEMORA.

His Condition So Precarious that It Has Been Determined to Remove the Ex-Policy King to State's Prison Hospital.

Superintendent of Prisons Collins has decided to move "Al" Adams, the ex-Policy King, now serving a sentence in Sing Sing Prison, to the late Hospital at Dannemora.

Dr. Irvine, the physician at Sing Sing Prison, after a careful examination of Adams reported that he is suffering from diabetes and consumption of the throat, and that his condition is such that he may have a stroke of paralysis at any time.

Adams was assigned to the mat manufacturing shop on his arrival at the prison, but he has not been able to do any hard work. Odd jobs have been given to him to occupy his mind and keep him from brooding over his trouble.

The date for his removal to the State hospital has not been fixed, but he will probably be taken away within a very few days.

DIVORCE GIVEN TO MRS. PAULINE KOCH.

Husband Who Deserted Her is a Fencing Master in New York Social Turn Verein.

TRENTON, May 11.—Vice-Chancellor Gray has advised a decree of divorce in the case of Pauline Koch, of Hoboken, against her husband, Charles Koch, a fencing master at the New York Social Turn Verein, at Eighty-fifth street and Lexington avenue, desertion having been the ground upon which a separation was sought.

The Vice-Chancellor also advises that the wife be given the custody of their nineteen-year-old son, Charles William Koch, who is now living with his mother at No. 111 Park avenue, Hoboken.

Mr. and Mrs. Koch were married on May 9, 1881, in New York, by Rev. Bartholomew Kruetz, of the German Presbyterian Church, and lived there until they moved to Hoboken a few years later.

Freight Engineer on Reading Road Scalded to Death and His Fireman Cut and Injured.




