A shrew who might have been tamed by spanking rather than by the corrective cracking of Petruccio's whip was the Katharine of Elsie Leslie at the Manhattan Theatre yesterday afternoon.

Mrs. Leslie was interesting, yet entirely too immature to be convincing as the highly-tempered lady of the Shakespearian comedy. To see her was to be constantly reminded that she was once Little Lord Fauntleroy and to wonder whether she had yet outgrown Mrs. Burnett's boy. There was the allurement of youth in this Katharine, but there was little else. It was difficult to imagine a Petruccio not bold enough to beard this lioness in her den.

David Belasco sat in a box, but he smiled not, neither did he clap. The darling of the gods—Blanche Bates, beside him—was likewise inscrutable. The gentleness of spring rested like a benediction upon the remainder of the audience, composed mostly of women, who smiled indulgently upon the Petruccio of Miss Leslie's husband, Jefferson Winter.

Mrs. Leslie's husband was rough and ferocious, like unto a floorwalker, but when he glared and growled no one cried "cash!" In other words, he was hardly the money.

This namesake of Rip is not "hefty" enough to wield the whip in "The Taming of the Shrew." It was good to recognize in Baptista our venerable friend Edwin Varney, as his presence dispelled the fear that he might not have survived the "Hamlet" conspiracy of Edmund Russell.

Aside from Mr. Varney and Richard Webster as Christopher Sly, the cast bore an unmistakably amateur aspect.

## HEADS OF REBELS ON CITY'S WALLS.

Tribesmen Defeated by Government Troops at Tetuan, but Fighting May Be Resumed.

MADRID, May 12.—A despatch from Ouz, Morocco, announces that the tribesmen who attacked Tetuan Monday were repulsed. They stubbornly fought their way through the suburbs to the foot of the walls, but the Imperial troops eventually regained their lost positions and drove off the rebels with heavy losses on both sides.

The battle was suspended in order to allow the opposing forces to bury their dead, numbering three hundred. Many heads were displayed on the walls of Tetuan.

Advices from Tangier announce that the Imperial forces have routed the rebel mountaineers near Fez, inflicting great losses on the enemy.

## STEAMER FAST ON SHOAL OF ROCKS.

Pembrokeshire, Bound for New York, Stranded in a Bad Place Near Shanghai.

SHANGHAI, May 12.—The British steamer Pembrokeshire, Capt. Dwyer, which sailed from here yesterday for New York, is ashore on the north Saddle Rocks, a dangerous point. Lighters and steam pumps have been sent to her assistance.

The Pembrokeshire has no passengers aboard. She is a freighter and is owned by a London firm.

Archbishop Kain Seeks Rest in a Sanitarium.

BALTIMORE, May 12.—Archbishop Kain, of St. Louis, arrived here yesterday and at once proceeded to St. Agnes Sanitarium, where he will undergo treatment for ailments from which he has long suffered. The Archbishop said his

stay at the sanitarium would be indefinite, it being his purpose to restore his shattered health before leaving.
