

BIGGEST MAN IN THE WORLD NOW IN TOWN

Edward Beupre, Beside Whom Even Other Giants Look Small, Pays His First Visit to New York. Where He Has Some Funny Adventures.

IS 8 FEET 2 INCHES TALL AND BUILT IN PROPORTION. Has Foot 22 Inches Long. Wears No. 10 Hat and Possesses Great Strength, but Is as Kind and Gentle as He Is Big.

The biggest man in the world is now in New York. He is Edward Beupre, a French-Canadian from the Northwest Territory. He is taking his month's strolling around the city for his legs are too long to put under in the conventional fashion, and he is sleeping diagonally across a bed with chairs under his legs and feet, in the Vanderbilt Hotel.

There is no doubt that this young man of twenty-two is the greatest giant living. He is 8 feet 2 inches in height and weighs 367 pounds. He knows the proportions of all other giants in existence, and the human being next to him in size is a Frenchman, who stands 7 feet 8 inches.

Strong and Kind as He Is Big. When Beupre landed at the Grand Central Station there was a commotion. Women screamed and little children clinging to their mothers crying to be saved from the "big man."

His nature is as great and kind as his proportions are big. He never had a quarrel in his life because no one would ever think of quarrelling with him. He admits modestly that he has lifted a horse weighing 500 pounds as high as his head. He can pick up a man like George Gardner, the champion light-heavyweight, in one hand and dangle him in the air without taking a deep breath.

Beupre's shoes are twenty-two inches from heel to toe, his collar twenty-two inches, his hat one and a half yards, and his trousers one and a half yards. "Every thing I wear has to be made to order—shoes, hats, shirts, collars, cuffs, underwear, everything."

Beupre says he does not eat any more than an ordinary man and the people of this city are not so fat as they are in his country. "How do I sleep?" replied the giant laughingly. "I sleep in my time, getting around hotels, but I usually manage to sleep across the bed with chairs under my feet.
