

WAS PROMINENT IN CHARITY WORK.

Many Will Mourn Miss Katherine Vaubel, Only 18 Years Old, Stricken by Death from Field of Usefulness.

Katherine Vaubel, who had been prominent in the charitable work done by Grace Episcopal Church and who was one of the prettiest girls on the east side, is dead. She was only eighteen years old.

It seems but yesterday that she was with her companions in the little Friendly Society of Grace Chapel. She was always so bright and cheerful and lovable that wherever she went sunshine went with her. It is longer than yesterday, however, that she was missed. A week ago she complained of feeling ill, but with her usual courageous spirit she would not give in. She persuaded her parents, and even herself, that nothing serious was the matter with her. On Saturday she was too ill to leave home, and despite her protestations a physician was called. Miss Vaubel was removed immediately to an uptown hospital, where she died Sunday evening.

The funeral will take place from the Vaubel home, No. 21 East Eleventh street, to-morrow, The Rev. Dr. Bailey, of Grace Chapel, will read the service.

TEACHER DROWNED WHILE IN BATHING

Miss Josephine McNally, of Brooklyn, Caught in a Fatal Trap in the Surf at Springtown, R. I.

The family of Miss Josephine McNally, twenty-two years old, a teacher in Public School No. 30, Walcott and Van Brunt streets, living at No. 10 Bedford avenue, Brooklyn, was prostrated to-day when news came of the young woman's drowning in the surf at Springtown, R. I., where she was spending her vacation.

Miss McNally, with five other young women, including her twin sister, Jennie D. McNally, went bathing in the surf, and as a high sea was running they were cautioned not to go far from the shore.

More venturesome than the others, Miss McNally and her closest friend, Miss Agnes Riley, of No. 126 Franklin avenue, Brooklyn, went out further than the others. They were a considerable distance when Miss McNally was caught in a strong undertow and screamed. Miss Riley started to assist her and she, too, was trapped.

The other four young women's screams attracted the attention of two unknown young men in a boat. Before they could reach Miss McNally she sank. Miss Riley was being carried by the undertow when they reached her and rowed her ashore. It required half an hour to resuscitate her.

The young women were almost crazed by the drowning of Miss McNally, and ran up and down the beach wringing their hands and crying. While the men were trying to revive Miss Riley one of the women saw the drift of Miss McNally floating and shouted to the men, who went out and recovered it.

The body will be brought to Brooklyn for burial.

An unknown woman was found drowned in the South Shrewsbury River.

near Long Branch to-day by George W. Huff, a boat builder. The body is now at William H. Morris's morgue awaiting identification.

The woman was about sixty years of age, 4 feet in height, black hair mixed with gray, and weighed about one hundred and fifty pounds. The body floated in a white lawn waist, crash skirt, with long black ribbon around waist and when found her hand still clutched an umbrella. It had not been in the water more than twenty-four hours.

HE GAVE HIS LIFE TO SAVE A CHILD

Francisco Elia Dies from Injuries Received by Being Struck Down and Crushed by a Wagon in the Street.

Francisco Elia, a grocer at No. 61 Mott street, died in the Hudson Street Hospital to-day from the injuries he received yesterday in a successful and heroic attempt to save the life of four-year-old Jairo Dellitelli.

Elia was standing in front of his store when a horse and wagon belonging to Kong Tia Chong & Co., Chinese grocers at No. 22 Pell street, came racing down crowded Mott street, driven by Guglielmo Campi. The Italian boy was in its path and, heedless of its swift approach, the little fellow was playing with his red toy wagon.

Francisco darted out into the street and grabbed the boy. But the shaft of the wagon struck him and he hurled the boy to safety while he was knocked down. The horse stepped on him and the wheels of the wagon passed over him. At the hospital the doctors said his ribs had been broken and that he had sustained internal injuries from which he could not recover.
