

PASTOR 74 YEARS OLD WILL WED

Rev. Dr. William Nichols Durnell, Rector of All Saints', Will Take His Housekeeper for His Second Wife.

FRIENDS FOR YEARS, HE THINKS HER A JEWEL.

Bride-to-Be Was the Trusted Companion of the Minister's First Wife for More than Three Decades.

The Rev. William Nichols Durnell, rector of All Saints' Protestant Episcopal Church, does not believe that it is good for man to be alone, and he does not think that age should be any obstacle. He is in his seventy-fourth year and has just surprised his flock by announcing his approaching marriage. He does not say that this is a love match. He admits that he wants some one to care for him and to take care of his home, and he thinks that in Miss Anna Maria Megele he has found the woman that will fill the bill.

Miss Megele is not young. She is past middle age and is hale and hearty. But for thirty-two years Miss Megele has lived in the rector's house, most of the time as a companion to Dr. Durnell's wife, who died two years ago.

Speaking to his friends of his proposed marriage, the white-haired clergyman said that he had passed the romantic age and was in the practical. He therefore practices the practical housewife makes a most desirable life partner, and while he is not merely thinking of the material comforts of this life he knows that a well-ordered and comfortable house, will help him along in his work.

"You see," he said this morning with a twinkle in his eye, "I have had Miss Megele on trial and she has proved to me that she is an eminently practical and good housekeeper. I think the time has come, therefore, when she shall be rewarded for her thrift and industry and promoted to an interest in my domestic partnership."

Dr. Durnell says that the wedding ceremony will be performed in the old church of which he has been pastor so many years, and the date will be Jan. 6. Only intimate relatives will attend, and then the newly-wedded pair will go on a trip to Asheville, N. C.

Dr. Durnell has been chaplain of the Twenty-second Regiment for twenty-two years. This makes him the senior chaplain of the National Guard of the State of New York. He is also president of the Palestine Commandery, Knights Templar, and is well known in Masonic circles.

He is a prominent member of the Sons of the Revolution and the Sons of the Colonial Wars. All over the east side the pastor is known for his good fellowship and his good deeds. His door is ever open to the poor and his pocket-book always opens at the call of the needy. He has the distinction of being elected the only Christian member of the New Era Club, a Jewish organization.

Miss Megele is the orphaned daughter of Anthony P. J. Megele, a merchant of Hamburg, Germany. She came to this country after the death of her parents to earn her own living, and was at once engaged as companion to Dr. Durnell's wife. In that capacity she remained until two years ago, when Mrs. Durnell died.

MUST WAIT FIVE YEARS FOR BRIDE

Harry Williams, "Professional Pickpocket," Who Just Married Stella Hamilton, is Sentenced to Sing Sing Prison.

Harry Williams, the young pickpocket who was married in the Tombs yesterday by civil contract to one Stella Hamilton, will have to postpone his honeymoon for five years. He was sentenced to Sing Sing for that length of time by Judge Cowing to-day.


Williams was arrested charged with attempting to steal a watch from Arthur Hilton, son of the late Judge Hilton, on an Eighty-sixth street car. When arraigned for trial he entered a plea of guilty and gave his occupation as "professional pickpocket."

While awaiting sentence in the Tombs the Hamilton girl made her appearance and clamored to be allowed to marry him. No clergyman could be found to perform the ceremony.

Judge Cowing said to-day that he felt no mercy for Williams, and he imposed the maximum sentence. "This young man has already served four terms in the 'box,'" he said. "He ought to be put away like a mad dog."

The bride was in court, but a court officer requested her to leave while Williams was being sentenced.

HORSES PLUNGE INTO DEEP TRENCH

Heavy Truck Team Breaks Through Plank Covering and One Animal Is Killed by Fall—Driver Escapes Uninjured.

A pair of heavy truck horses attached to one of the Lion Brewery wagons were being driven at a fast pace through Forty-second street at 6 o'clock this morning. At Lexington avenue there is a trench ten feet deep and seven feet wide. This was covered by boards.

When the horses and the truck reach-

ed it the horses swerved on to the boards and crashed through it. One of the horses went to the bottom of the trench and was instantly killed. The other was caught by some of the boards and suspended half way. The driver of the truck, John Harting, of No. 99 Columbus avenue, was not hurt. The uninjured horse was taken out of the trench with the aid of a derrick.






