D. J. SULLY MUST REVEAL SECRETS

Ex-Cotton King Will Be Compelled to Tell Names of Men Who Backed Him and What Became of Profits.

Daniel J. Sully, the dethroned cotton king, will be compelled to reveal the secrets of the cotton pool which sent so many to ruin before he went down in the whirlpool. He must tell also the names of the men who backed him in his efforts to manipulate the cotton market, and he must tell what became of the enormous profits he is known to have made during the rise in prices since he assumed command of the market eighteen months ago.

He must reveal also the names of the men who played "sweetheart poker" with him in a room in the Hoffman House, when the winnings were pledged to the sweethearts and wives of the players.

All these revelations are made possible by the Bankruptcy act of 1903, which demands that a bankrupt must be heard in open court or at a meeting of his creditors before settlement.

Secrets Cannot Be Kept. To save these secrets from becoming public property every effort is being made by Sully and the men who have backed him in his dealings, and who have profited by his losses, and who have played "sweetheart poker" with him to effect a settlement with the creditors, and thereby save themselves from positions that may prove embarrassing.

Samuel Untermyer said to-day, when asked about the feelings of Sully's creditors toward Sully at this juncture, that he would believe Sully could make any offer that would satisfy his creditors.

Some proceedings would be forced shortly, he said, and he expected sensational revelations to follow. What the sensational revelations are to be he would not say.

STOCKS HOLD UP ON SECRET BUYING

Wall Street Hears that Rival Forces Are Out for Merger. Road Shares and Heavy Purchases Lifts the List.

Stocks benefited to-day by the demand for Northern and Union Pacific and Northern Securities, the buying being accredited to rivals in the big merger. The two first named were taken steadily, while the well-defined story was circulated about the Morgan-Hill combination was buying the issues in order to offset Mr. Harriman's practical control of Northern Pacific. The latter advanced sharply and was up 3-8. The Northern Securities stock on the curb attracted a great deal of attention, and there were rumors that an effort was being made to corner the stock. It opened strong, became weak, and then strong again, and there was quite a little persistent buying.

There was a big demand for Northern Securities stubs on the curb and a small lot sold for 200 a stub. This is something new to Wall street and there were many who did not understand what the sales of stubs meant. When the stock is turned in each holder receives a certain percentage of the Northern Pacific and Great Northern shares, but is required to retain one share of the Northern Securities stock which entitles him to an interest in the assets of the company. It is these shares that are being sold and bid for at 200.

The price movement to-day was erratic. The opening was irregular and later the whole market became weak. Then the heavy buying in Northern and Union Pacific began and thousands of shares were bought at constantly advancing prices. Pennsylvania was also strong and active and under the leadership of these three issues the whole market advanced a full point.

There was little news outside of the interest in the Northern Securities case. The bank statement will probably be a good one, and iron and steel shows constant improvement. But as long as the market for the big interests continue to be irregular and erratic, the market will be irregular and erratic. The trading during the first hour was small, but the second hour saw the sales more than doubled, and business from that time on continued in a volume to rival the best of the late season, however, dealings ceased off, but prices held to a good level.

The total sales of stocks were 650,000 shares, and of bonds \$1,472,000.
