

PARKER, WITHOUT DOUBT, SAYS MACK

Democratic National Committeeman from New York Declares the Judge is Sure to Be Nominated by Democrats.

Norman F. Mack, member of the Democratic National Committee from this State, who is stopping at the Hoff-

man House, said today that Judge Parker's nomination by the Democrats is as certain as that of President Roosevelt by the Republicans. Judge Parker will make a great candidate and a winning fight in the bargain, said Mr. Mack. This is to be a Democratic year, National and State, and we are already justified in preparing for a celebration of victory. We have figured out already that the Parker man in the State Convention will comprise 75 per cent. of the full representation. We do not expect that Charles F. Murphy will continue his fight for an uninstruted delegation when he feels the pulse of the convention. There has been considerable talk of nominating Mayor McClellan for Governor as a sort of compromise, but it is too early to talk of the gubernatorial

nomination. That will come later. No doubt Mayor McClellan would make an admirable candidate for Governor, but Judge Parker is the man of the hour just now. We up-State Democrats are all enthusiastically lined up for him and will go to the convention next Monday prepared to endorse him as the choice of this State. His popularity has already extended into the west, and judging from reports we are receiving daily there is nothing now that can stem the tide for the Judge. After his nomination, and not until then, will the Judge make a public statement regarding his views on political issues. I apprehend that these views of the learned judge will be more than interesting to the voters of this country.
