

DOWIE TO TRY NEW YORK AGAIN

Zion City Prophet Will Make Another Effort to Teach New Yorkers Something, and Will Preach at Three Meetings.

WILL BE WELCOMED AT CARNEGIE HALL JUNE 26.

Elijah III. Now on His Way Back from Australia, Where He Had a Most Strenuous Experience with the "Heathens."

Old Dr. Dowie will take another shy at the flesh pots of New York city. His agents have engaged Carnegie Music Hall for Sunday, June 26, when the self-styled Elijah three times, will hold forth morning, afternoon and evening in an effort to explain his recent peppery experiences in Australia and sell some more of his Zion City books.

Elijah will be accompanied by his unknissed son, J. Gladstone Dowie, and his wife, Mrs. Jane Dowie. Their arrival in New York from a Cunard liner will be the occasion for the assemblage here of the heads of the Dowie church. John Alexander Dowie sailed from San Francisco on Jan. 17 last. His wife and son had previously gone to Australia leaving New York during the dark days of the New York visitation, when Dowie was on exhibition at Madison Square Garden. Cablegrams from Australia have told of Dowie's narrow escape from lynching at Sidney, Auckland and Melbourne, and his final flight to Adelaide, where he sought refuge with his family in the home of his wife's parents.

His Retinue with Him.
And now Dowie is on his way back to the United States. In his party besides his family are his personal attendant, Col. Carl Stern; his ecclesiastical secretary, J. S. Excell, and associate editor, Arthur G. Newcomb, also other minor attendants and servants. The party reached Marseilles May 7, and after visiting Cannes and Zurich will spend several weeks in England before sailing for New York.

"The General Overseer has been in weekly communication with the faithful at Zion City by cablegram ever since his departure," said Deacon Corlette, in charge of the New York headquarters in the Flatiron Building, to a Evening World reporter to-day.

"He will receive a welcome home that will astonish the outside world. There are now 850 members in New York, and it is expected that all of the subordinate overseers, and many other church officers will be here to give him a joyous welcome."

Paying Off Bad Debts.
"Before Dr. Dowie gets here we will have met the second payment due our creditors under the arrangement made with Judge Kohlsaat. It falls on June 13, and amounts to \$100,000. Many of the bond in Zion City at the time of our financial difficulties went forth into the world and are earning good wages, all of which will go toward paying off the debt, which amounts to less than half a million dollars."

Overseer Mason, just in from a ministering tour in this vicinity, told the Evening World that Elijah III still hoped to make another New York visitation in 1915.
"Instead of holding the meetings in Madison Square Garden, it is planned to hire halls in the Bowery, Manhattan, Brooklyn and Jersey City, and divide the host of 10,000," said the Overseer. "We may have Madison Square Garden for a few meetings, over which the General Overseer will preside. But Dr. Dowie hopes to get away with results from the small meetings. Already the converts are arriving from Australia, over one hundred having passed through New York on their way to Zion City."

BRAVE POLICEMEN SAVE LIVES AT A BLAZE IN JERSEY CITY.

Several Jersey City policemen proved themselves heroes during a fire that started in a Chinese laundry in upper Central avenue and which threatened tenement-houses on either side.

The fire, after starting in Wah Lung's laundry, quickly spread to the adjoining buildings. Firemen and policemen arrived quickly upon the scene. The prospective loss of the wash of Wah Lung's customers was lost sight of by the police and firemen when the lives of the tenants on each side of the burning frame building were recognized as being at stake.

Sergeant George Murphy, in charge of a squad of ten policemen, turned his attention to the saving of lives. Acting under his instructions the men under him hurried through the buildings adjoining the one burning, awakening the inmates, into whose apartments suffocating smoke was pouring.

With the assistance of his men, including Patrolman Wolf, who rescued a sleeping babe in the apartments of Mrs. James Langton, of No. 105 Griffith street, every one of the scores of inmates of the two tenements was

awakened and rescued. Wolf was assisted by Patrolman Miller. The Chinaman, Wah Lung, was rescued by the police sergeant, who groped his way into the burning laundry, found the unconscious Chinaman and bore him to the street.

The firemen confined the flames to the burning building, which was owned by Harry Boehs, who kept a butcher shop next door to the laundry.
