

STOCKS SEE-SAW IN SLOW MARKET

Trading in Specialties the Only Noticeable Feature of the Day's Dealings in Which Early Losses Are Regained.

CONSOLIDATED GAS SOLD.

Copper, Steel, B. R. T., Sugar, the Pacific, Delaware & Hudson, Pennsylvania and Smelters Given Attention.

Stocks moved in a lacy see-saw fashion to-day, prices opening mixed, then advancing, then falling off and finally climbing again to the starting level.

Before noon St. Paul, Reading, Erie, the Pacific and Brooklyn Rapid Transit improved, while Amalgamated Copper, United States Steel and Pennsylvania fell off.

Consolidated Gas was a factor in the trading, owing to the increase in the company's capital. It rallied in the late forenoon but closed over a point lower.

Additional dealings were made in the early afternoon in the specialties, Delaware and Hudson dropping to 151-1/4 and General Electric and Smelting losing 1-1/2 and 1-1/4 respectively.

Amalgamated Copper, United States Steel Preferred, Sugar, Brooklyn Transit, Union Pacific, Missouri Pacific, Southern Pacific and Pennsylvania were also under moderate pressure.

Delaware and Hudson subsequently rallied 1-1/4 and lifted the list. Trading continued dull to the close.

The total sales were 140,600 shares and the bonds \$1,227,000.

CASHIER CAMERON IS STILL MISSING

His Family in Brooklyn Hasn't Heard of Him Since He Disappeared—Mrs. Cameron Too Ill to See Callers.

At the home of Clarence F. Cameron, No. 41 Second street, Brooklyn, to-day it was said that nothing had been heard of or from the missing cashier of Munz, Bon & Co., the suspended cotton broker.

Mrs. Cameron, her mother-in-law, an Evening World reporter, was still prostrated, and by order of the doctor could see no one.

"Members of the family," said Mrs. Cameron's mother, "have been to see the firm and have been assured that no charges against Mr. Cameron are contemplated, that the firm's sole hope and anxiety is to have Mr. Cameron return and assist in straightening out the books."

Asked if Cameron's disappearance had been reported to the police by the family, Mrs. Cameron's mother replied: "No, we did not believe that the turning in of a general alarm would be of any aid in finding Mr. Cameron."
