TREATS VOLUNTEER FIREMEN

Brewers Will Give Them Banquet for Saving Buildings.

The big stables attached to the Rubsam & Horrmann brewery at Stapleton, S. L., were burned to the ground early today. The loss is estimated at \$100,000.

The fifty horses in the stables were safely taken out by the volunteer firemen, who were very quickly on the scene and did such good work in saving the main brewery buildings that the company has invited them all to a big dinner on Saturday night.

No one knows how the fire started. A night watchman was the first to discover it, and when he opened the doors of the hayloft the whole place was ablaze.

GAVE CIGARETTE TO MONKEY

There was Fire in It and Things Happened.

Charged with giving a lighted cigarette to a monkey in Central Park and otherwise causing and causing the death of a child, David Solomon, thirty years old, of No. 189 Third avenue, was arraigned today before Magistrate Flannery. Patrolman O'Loughlin said the monkey put the lighted cigarette in his mouth and then proceeded in a violent acrobatic stunt all about a large cage of monkeys and threw them into a real monkey panic. The policeman said the monkey was severely burned in the mouth.

Before Solomon experimented with the lighted cigarette, the policeman said, he had amused himself in poking the monkey with a stick, which served to put them in a state of excitement. Magistrate Flannery said that Solomon's imprisonment overnight had been sufficient punishment and discharged him with a reprimand.

DON'T TELL MOTHER, DYING CHILD'S PLEA

Little Eugene Aichuler, Who Was Mortally Hurt by a Fall, Made This Request and Then Expired.

Eugene Aichuler, six years old, of No. 29 West One Hundred and Fourteenth street, died today in the Harlem Hospital from a fractured skull. He was brought there last night after falling from the tiled roof landing of the fire escape, where he was playing with some other children.

Eugene did not regain consciousness until this morning, when he told the nurse who was attending him, "Don't tell mother if I die." The nurse promised that she would not and left the boy for a few minutes. When she returned Eugene was dead.
