

## MILLIONAIRE AS A WIFE-BEATER

Moore Tried to Drag Wife Down to His Level and Lands in Police Cell, Although a Rich Man.

Edward H. Moore, heir to \$1,000,000, but dressed in garments so coarse, rugged and soiled that he might be taken for a tramp or even a mendicant, sat in a cell in the Myrtle avenue police station to-day charged with beating his young and pretty wife, who married him when he was a promising young man a few years ago, before the dawn drink had undermined his moral sense, made his face with dissipation and named of him as outcast from society.

Moore's home is now at No. 101 44th avenue, Brooklyn. His young wife, a woman of education and refinement, whose face shows traces of beauty, the result of many beatings, lives at No. 101 St. Felix street, Brooklyn. It was on her charge of cruelty that Moore was arrested and held in \$1,000 bail for trial by Magistrate Tighe.

**Married Six Years.**  
According to the wife, she married Moore six years ago in Sheffield, England. His mother was the daughter of a wealthy brewer, and at her death some years ago she left her entire estate of \$20,000 pounds to her husband, stipulating in her will that the money was to go to her son at the death of the husband and father.

Two years ago the Moores came to America. Moore, as the wife alleges, had already begun to drink more than was good for him, and he was not long in becoming a slave to the habit after he reached America.

The husband and wife run short of funds, and the wife was forced to become a seamstress to provide food for herself. Then there came abuse, she says, and she left Moore and secured a home for herself.

**Wife's Bad Story.**  
The wife told Magistrate Tighe of the abuse she had received at the hands of her husband, and the Magistrate, looking down at the prisoner, cried out: "You miserable loafer!"

During the wife's recital Moore sat in the court room with a stupid leer on his face. He seemed indifferent when the Magistrate held him in \$1,000 bail on his wife's charges, and was led away to his cell to await the time when he will be called for trial.
