STEEL AND SUGAR STOCKS BADLY CUT

Pressure on Leading Issues in the Market Causes a Decline, and Prices Close Showing Losses All Around.

TRACTIONS GIVEN SUPPORT.

Wall Street Hears that Reported Street Railway Deal Has Been Completed—Pennsylvania Freely Offered and Taken—Bonds Quiet.

Speculation fell off considerably during the final session on the Stock Exchange to-day, and prices closed fractionally lower all around. Profit-taking was in order during the afternoon, and bullish operators were encouraged to sell the market short to some extent, although they were a bit cautious.

There was particularly heavy pressure on Steel preferred and Sugar, the latter selling off over 2 points. The former suffered fractionally, due to predictions of unsettlement in the trade.

Good support was given the Smelting issues, the common closing with an advance of almost 1 1/2 on the day, while the preferred was unchanged.

There was believed to be a big short interest in Pennsylvania. Offerings in that stock were well absorbed, the buying being regarded as good.

The local traction group received fairly good attention, the closing being irregular. This was due to the report that the street railway deal has practically been completed.

In the railroad list losses were confined to fractions, the chief supporters being Atchafalpa, St. Paul, Louisville and Nashville, Norfolk and Western, Ontario and Western, Reading, Southern Pacific and Union Pacific. Losses of from 1/4 to almost 1 point were noted in the Erie.

The bond market was quiet. The total sales of stocks were 519,500 shares and of bonds \$2,820,000.
