

STOCKS LOSE LIFE AND PRICES CUT Southern Pacific Best of the Few Good Issues in Market That Declined Steadily Almost from the Start.

COAL AND STEEL ARE CUT. Canadian Pacific, Atchafal, St. Paul, Reading, Erie and Louisville & Nashville Head Railroads in Sag Metropolitan Securities Up.

Stocks closed lower to-day, with trading light after a session that was distinguished almost from the start. The market opened irregular, then rallied, but the advance was maintained only in a few cases, the rest sagging steadily throughout the day.

The weakness of the industrial market, it being more than a point lower, while the preferred was higher. The steel issues were off a shade, Canadian Pacific, Atchafal, St. Paul, Louisville and Nashville, Ontario and Reading were the chief losers of the day, showing a decline of from 1/4 to 1/2 per cent. The coal and steel were off fractionally.
