

DRUG SWINDLERS NOT ALL CAUGHT

Big Wholesale House Now Under Suspicion, and More Arrests Are Expected to Be Made in Connection with Frauds.

MINDEN SAID TO BE LEADER OF THE GANG.

Police Declare Goods Found in His and Wooten's Possession Will Furnish Complete Evidence of Their Guilt.

Simon B. Minden, Manville Thomas, Charles S. Horn, Charles P. Risley and Walter S. Ricker, will be arraigned in Centre Street Police Court to-day, charged with being in the gigantic drug swindle.

But the work of the police is not yet half done according to a statement made at Police Headquarters.

At the hearing this afternoon George Gordon Battle and George B. Hayes will be there to press the charges against them.

"Minden appears to be the ringleader of the lot," said Mr. Battle; "we are convinced that he was practically directing the whole illegal business in drugs and that he was reaping the lion's share of the profits."

Druggist and Physician.

"Minden is not only a druggist, but a physician as well, and his knowledge of the two professions was a valuable asset to him in the counterfeiting of pills and powders of a proprietary brand.

"In the raid on Minden's store the police got possession of a large amount of stuff that will go to show conclusively that he was extensively engaged in the drug-swindling business."

Wholesale House Suspected.

"The police are searching for further evidence against a large wholesale drug house in the city. They already have reason to believe that this concern abetted Minden and some of his confederates in the swindle."

The arrest of Wooten is considered of no less importance than is that of Minden. He was at one time associated with several schemes with Alfred R. Goslin.
