## KUROPATKIN RENEWS BATTLE WITH JAPS

### Hostilities Recaptured After Resting from Bloody Conflict Lasting Nine Days, With the Armies Lined Up on Opposite Sides of the Shakhe River.

### Siege of Fort Arthur Continues with Constant Shelling by the Japs, Who Have Damaged Many Buildings and Ships in the Harbor.

MUKDEN, Oct. 21.—The Russian guns opened fire at daybreak to-day, and the great nine-day battle of the Shakhe River, which was interrupted only by the desperate exhaustion of the contending armies, was renewed. The two armies are now lined up on opposite sides of the river.

Toward evening yesterday the fog that had hung over the scene for days lifted, and the opposing armies were found to be everywhere in touch. The Russian fire to-day against the Japanese was not answered, either from scarcity of ammunition or the desire not to reveal the location of their batteries.

The weather and the condition of the roads have made extensive operations impossible, but the roads are now drying hard and the general engagement may be resumed very soon.

ST. PETERSBURG, Oct. 21.—The War Office made public to-day a list of the losses of Gen. Ekik's Seventy-first Division of the Fifth Siberian Corps and Gen. Morozoff's First Division of Lieut.-Gen. Dembowski's corps. Each lost half a dozen officers.

The official lists of officers killed and wounded between Oct. 11 and Oct. 13 totals 172, including Major-Gen. Kabinski and seventeen field officers killed. The wounded are in the proportion of six to one.

The list for the heaviest day's fighting is still unreported, and doubtless will exceed the losses at Liaoyang, when 500 officers were killed or wounded. The losses among the men are not yet reported, but they are thought to approximate not much over twenty thousand.

News from Port Arthur brought to Chefoo by a junk which left there Oct. 19 says a fierce bombardment, which began Oct. 16, was still progressing without interruption. Many buildings had been damaged and ships in the harbor had also been hit by shells, but the character and extent of the damages are not stated.

The Japanese main forces are now posted at Ludiaulung. They have placed guns of large calibre on Lunjia Mountain. The Russians continue making sorties successfully and inflicting heavy losses on the besiegers, whose losses since the commencement of the siege are said to have been 50,000.

## MORGAN'S ORDER GIVES ALL A CHANCE TO REGISTER

### Superintendent of Elections Directs that All Who Are in Line at 10 o'Clock Be Put on List—Gives Up Citizens' Papers That Were Seized.

The storm of the early morning and a modification of the rules that governed the Morgan deputies during the first two days of registration made to-day's registration extremely quiet. Although the State Superintendent of Elections' men swarmed around the registration booths they were almost tame enough to eat out of a voter's hand.

Mr. Morgan issued one order that pleased the leaders on both sides. He directed the election officers to enroll every legal voter who is waiting in line at ten o'clock, the hour set for closing. This will prevent the shutting out of any one who is delayed in reaching a registration booth.

The registration difficulties have resolved themselves into a political battle with Supt. Morgan and the Republican machine on one side and Tammany Hall on the other. Both are protesting for the purity of the ballot, Tammany asserting that the real object of Mr. Morgan is to intimidate Democratic voters.

The Superintendent of Elections was compelled to make a complete back-down to-day on his attitude regarding the right to seize the naturalization papers of men applying for registration. He announced that he had returned of the papers seized by deputies at his office last Tuesday, and thus forestalled an attempt on the part of Tammany to make a test case.

A writ of Replevin. Charles Hoffman, for Tammany Hall, got a writ of replevin from Civil Justice Joseph yesterday calling upon Morgan and certain of his deputies to return the citizenship papers of William Kunslich, of No. 22 East Houston street, which were taken from him on Tuesday. A city marshal, accompanied by Mr. Hoffman and several Tammany politicians, went to Mr. Morgan's office to-day to serve the writ.

the other papers seized last Tuesday had been returned to their owners. "This is a subterfuge," said Lawyer Hoffman. "Mr. Morgan does not dare take the issue to court. He knew we had this writ and hustled out to Judge H. Please inform Mr. Morgan that Tammany Hall has advised voters that he has no right to take their citizenship papers from them, that his action in returning these papers is an admission of it, and that they attempt to repeat his action will get him into serious trouble."

Storm Leaders Gloomy. Political leaders were gloomy at the outlook for registration early in the day, but when the clouds disappeared and the sun came out they smiled with anticipation. This is the last day for one registration, and ordinarily is a heavy day. Because of the storm the registration will have to run up enormously before night to equal the record of a year ago.

The falling off in registration prevailed in all districts, Republican and Democratic. Up to 11 o'clock there had not been more than twenty-five registrations in some districts, and during the hardest part of the storm the registration places were deserted save for their challenge lists. He mentioned the case of a man who had voted from the same house for years who was refused registration to-day and went away rather than swear he had right to vote when he was challenged.

A sub-committee of the Law Committee of Tammany Hall was in session at the Wigwam all day, and Tammany lawyers were located in each Assembly district in readiness for trouble. Reports to Tammany indicate that the Morgan deputies are following the advice given them by Deputy Attorney-General Collins, who has told Mr. Morgan that his men have no right to challenge. The police have also been informed by Mr. Collins that they have no right to arrest a man

## FOUR INJURED IN SALOON BATTLE

### Michael Luonzo (His Wife and Two Others Resisted Arrest and Two Policemen Were Badly Beaten in Brooklyn.

Michael Luonzo and his wife Rosa, of No. 69 Washington avenue, Brooklyn, are in a hospital, Michael Murri, Luonzo's brother-in-law, and Antonio Comerrall are in jail, Policemen Doherty and Downs, of the Grand avenue station, are home on sick leave nursing serious injuries, and Luonzo's saloon is a wreck, all because somebody sent an eight-year-old girl out after a can of beer.

The child brought the beer at Luonzo's saloon from Comerrall, the bartender. Downs saw her leaving the place with it, asked how old she was and then went into the saloon to arrest Comerrall.

He was starting out with the bartender when he was confronted by Luonzo. Downs pushed him out of the way, whereupon the saloon keeper smashed him in the face. Downs drew his club, but before he had a chance to use it Murri hit him on the head from behind with a billiard cue.

All Three Jumped on Him. Then all three men jumped on Downs. He retreated to a corner and drew his revolver. Murri hit him on the right arm, breaking it, and the revolver fell to the floor, to be picked up by Luonzo. In the meanwhile some one had run to No. 65 Washington avenue, a place of registration, and informed Policeman Doherty, on duty there, that Downs was being killed. Doherty instructed his informant to telephone for the reserves and went to Luonzo's saloon on the run.

As he burst in the door Luonzo turned and fired a shot at him from Downs's revolver. The bullet passed between Doherty's legs, slipping a piece of cloth over his trousers. He was reaching for his own revolver when the ready Murri stepped up behind him with the billiard cue, hit him on the side of the head and knocked him senseless.

This left Downs with a broken arm and his club against the three Italians, who were reinforced in a moment by Luonzo's wife. She was armed with a butcher knife, and fought harder than the men to get to Downs, who managed to stand them off. They paid no attention to the prostrate Doherty, and went on the floor.

Capt. Lawrence Murphy was in the station house when the call came for the reserves. He grabbed a club called all the men in sight and started for the scene of the riot on the double quick. On the way he picked up all the policemen he saw and he had half a score back of him when he burst in the front door.
