

### RED FLAG MADE HIM DRINK GREEN

Man on Park Row Driven to Creme de Menthe and Irish Whiskey When He Sees the British Union Jack Flying.

SAD DAY FOR IRELAND, HE SAYS IN HIS GRIEF.

### KAISER AGAIN TO BE OPERATED ON

Physicians Decide that Knife Must Be Used to Remove Cancerous Growth in Throat of the Emperor.

MUCH ALARM FELT THROUGHOUT EMPIRE.

Royal Patient Advised to Abstain from All Mental and Physical Exertion—His Trip South Likely to Be Postponed.

LONDON, Nov. 14.—Private despatches from Berlin state that the condition of Emperor William is such that his physicians have advised him to abstain from all exertion, both mental and physical.

They have also decided that another operation on the Kaiser is necessary. It is announced that the Kaiser's trip to the south during the winter is still a question of doubt.

Emperor William underwent an operation some time ago for a cancerous growth in his throat. It was widely announced at the time that the growth was benign.

Father Died of Same Disease.

His father, the Emperor Frederick, died of a cancer in the throat, the first operation in his case being followed by announcements on the authority of Sir Morrell Mackenzie and other famous surgeons that the growth was of a benign character. This saved Frederick the throne and gave him the reign of ninety days, as under the laws of Germany no man can ascend the throne who is the victim of hereditary disease.

The Emperor Frederick died as the result of a second operation that was performed after his accession to the throne.

Announcement Causes Alarm.

When the cancerous growth first made its appearance in the throat of Emperor William it was feared that the curse of the Hohenzollerns had lighted upon him, and that he, too, would prove a victim.

Burgundy who removed the growth were positive in their statements that he growth was not malignant, but of a slight, benign character, and that here would be no ill effects.

This announcement that the Emperor will have to undergo another operation received with much alarm.

WOMAN HURT DODGING AUTO.

Falls Backward, Striking Head Against Curb.

In dodging a slowly approaching automobile to-day at One Hundred and Twenty-fifth street and Third avenue, Mrs. Mary Carroll jumped backward and fell, striking on her head and driving pieces of her comb into her scalp. Eckholm was the first to reach her side. He did not leave her until he had deposited her safely at her home. Mrs. Carroll admitted to Policeman Corcoran, of the East One Hundred and Twenty-sixth street station, that she was to blame, and refused to make a complaint against the chivalrous chauffeur.
