# MEYER NOT ARRESTED.

**Horoscope Professor Explains a Summons to Court.**

The statement was made yesterday that Astrologer Gustave Meyer, "The Nation's Counselor," had been arrested on complaint of a Hoboken saloon-keeper named Sylvester Lushich in connection with a horoscope reading. The professor was not arrested. He was only summoned—twice. On the first summons he was discharged. Later Lushich obtained a second summons, upon which Meyer will have a hearing next Thursday. The charge against him is based upon Section 1 of the Disorderly Persons Act, which defines as disorderly persons those "who shall use or pretend to use or have recourse to any skill in physiognomy, palmistry or like crafty science or who shall pretend to tell destinies or fortunes." A letter written by the professor to Lushich is the basis of the charge.

According to the professor, Lushich called upon him July 1 and ordered a horoscope life-reading for \$5. He had only \$2, which he paid on account, promising to pay the balance the next day. He did not appear, and the professor called at the Lushich place of business to see about it. Lushich said that he had told his wife that he had ordered a horoscope reading and that she had ordered him not to take it. The professor informed him that the horoscope of birth was worth \$3 alone. At last Lushich agreed to take a full and complete horoscope and pay the \$3 balance without the knowledge of his wife. But Meyer says he never paid it. Occasionally the professor sent him

advice, based, he says, upon his horoscopes. The final advice reached Lushich last week and warned him between Nov. 25 and Nov. 28 he would "experience great mental troubles and be quite unfortunate, and should guard against bad health, abortion, kidney troubles, burns, scalds, cuts, bruises, rashness, impetuosity, mistakes, accidents, trouble or loss through large animals." Lushich looked upon the letter in the light of a threat and consulted Chief of Police Hayes and Recorder Stanton about it. They advised him to get a summons, which he did. He failed to appear in court against Meyer yesterday and an order of discharge was entered, but later in the day Lushich procured an additional summons.
