

IRISH EXHIBIT TO COME HERE

Great National Display That Attracted Such Attention at the World's Fair in St. Louis to Be Shown in This City.

New York is to get the noted Irish Industrial Exhibit from the St. Louis Exposition.

This was assured to-day when the proceedings of a meeting of representatives of the Irish societies held in the Washington Post room at the Hoffman House, which was in session until 1 A. M. to-day, were made public. In many years a more enthusiastic gathering of Irishmen has not been known in this city, and it was indeed remarkable, for in it were represented conflicting elements which had not met on common ground in more than a decade.

In answer to the call of County President P. J. McNulty, of the Ancient Order of Hibernians, sixty-seven representatives of Irish organizations of New York appeared at the Hoffman House. Among them were members of thirty of the thirty-two county societies of this city, while others were from the Gaelic League, the Ancient Order of Hibernians, the Sixty-ninth Regiment, the Irish Volunteers, the Clan-na-Gael, the Irish National Club and the Greater New York Irish Athletic Association.

Commissioner of Parks John J. Pallan was elected chairman of the meeting, and William P. McLaughlin secretary.

Thomas F. Hanly, who did so much at St. Louis to make the exhibit a success, was present.

Valuable Help to Ireland. Mr. Hanly described the value of the exhibit to Ireland at this time; how it would do more than probably any other agency to arouse in the general public an interest in the reawakening nation across the seas; how it would demonstrate to minds long dormant on the subject that Ireland is a country of resources, capable of doing great things in commerce and the arts, and that she must be reckoned with in the industrial progress of the world.

"No spot on the face of the earth," said Mr. Hanly, "offers Ireland such advantages as a show place and a mart for manufacturers as does New York. New York is the market place of the world, and as a merchant let Ireland come here and open her park in the bazaar. Let her come as an individual with something for sale that others have not. The goods she has are goods that others must have and she will sell them and her patrons will ask for more."

Other gentlemen, who know what the exhibit is and who spent much of their time with it in St. Louis, also spoke along the lines of Mr. Hanly's address. They were D. F. Cahalan, H. G. Bannon and D. J. Moynahan. Encouraging letters, promising support, financial and otherwise, should the exhibit be displayed in New York, were received from John D. Crimmins, Commissioner of Police McAdoo and other prominent Irishmen.

Offer of the Hibernians. On behalf of the Ancient Order of Hibernians, County President McNulty pledged that organization to insure the promoters of the exhibit against financial loss, providing the Irish societies of the city would promise to lend a hand. No sooner had this been said than the delegates from the Irish societies present were on their feet to a man to say that their organizations would be with the Hibernians heart and soul.

President P. J. Conway, of the Greater New York Irish Athletic Association, caused a resolution to be adopted which provides for a general working committee to arrange for the display of the exhibit, the committee to be composed of representatives of the Irish societies already interested in the matter, and of Irishmen and friends of Ireland from the general public not associated with organizations.

Before the meeting adjourned it was decided that the exhibit would be shown in either Madison Square Garden or the Grand Central Palace. Dates for both of these places had been canvassed and it was reported that it would be possible to open the exhibit some time between the beginning and the middle of February. Perhaps an earlier date may be obtained. It will be displayed for a month.
