

WIDOW LIKES BALDWIN WILL

Beneficiary of Late President of L. I. Road Says She Requested Insertion of Clause About Second Marriage.

The declaration of Mrs. William H. Baldwin, Jr., the widow of the President of the Long Island Railroad, that a woman should renounce the estate of her husband in favor of her children if she remarries, has created much interest in women's clubs and among women generally. As an act of possible self-sacrifice Mrs. Baldwin's views are favorably received. But there the commendation generally ceases. It was at the request of Mrs. Baldwin that the clause limiting her enjoyment of the income of the estate of her husband to her widowhood was inserted. She believes that in the advent of a second marriage a complete renunciation should be made by the widow, Mrs. Baldwin has given deep thought to the

matter and her ideas are defined and positive. Mrs. Baldwin died on Jan. 4 at his Long Island home. He was forty-two years old, his wife being some years his junior. The value of the estate he left reached almost \$200,000, the enjoyable income from which means \$10,000 annually to Mrs. Baldwin.

Not a Believer in Remarriage
After a few specific bequests the will leaves the residue to Mrs. Baldwin so long as she remains single. In case of a second marriage the property is to be divided equally among the children. The will was probated on Saturday.

Mrs. Baldwin stands upon the broad principles of honor in arriving at her conclusions, although she is not a believer in remarriage as an institution in itself. She says that much misery comes in the train of a second marriage, many of which are made unfortunate by the mercenary desires of the men. Of this she says:
"Many a woman would have been happier if the law were so construed that estates should go to the children immediately upon the second marriage of the mother. The injustice comes to the children, who are often left unprotected while the second husband squanders the money of the first."
"No Right to Husband's Estate."
Mrs. Baldwin thinks that the moment a second marriage takes place

the women has not the moral right to consider herself entitled to any of his estate. "No matter what the law may say, the woman has no right to the enjoyment of the possessions of the husband. A woman should only consider herself the widow of a dead man as long as she actually remains his widow," she says. "Every man should have her made so that if it would be difficult for her to marry again. While I do not go to the extreme and say that there should be no second marriage, I must say that the more obstacles put in the way of it the better it will be for all."

Mr. Baldwin, in making his will, expressly declares that it was done "not as an indication of any objection to or disapproval of her marriage, should she see fit to marry again. There are three executors of the estate, Samuel Bowles, George S. Baldwin and Mrs. Baldwin. Should she re-marry she will cease to be an executor of the estate."

GIRLS FLEE FROM FLAMES.

Boy Drops a Candle into Bale of Oakum, Firing Building.
Charles Lehr, a boy employed in the plumbing establishment of E. A. Burr, at No. 39 East Eighth street, dropped a lighted candle in a bale of oakum today and set fire to the building. Before he could escape, the boy was severely burned about the face and hand. The fire spread throughout the lower floor of the four-story structure, but when the fire apparatus arrived it was quickly extinguished. The upper floors are occupied as offices, and a number of young girls had an exciting time getting out.

SAY BOY KILLED ANOTHER.

Stephen Geigler Arrested for Breaking Lad's Skull with Coal.
Charged with having killed Stephen Geigler, sixteen years old, by throwing a lump of coal at him while he was in bathing last August, William Woods, aged seventeen, was committed to the Tombs to-day by Coroner Schoer. Geigler was swimming in the East River at Ninety-fifth street when Woods, who was on a pier, is said to have hurled the coal at him. It struck the boy on the head, fracturing his skull, and he died three days later at the Presbyterian Hospital. The police had since been looking for Woods. A policeman saw him playing with a crowd of boys near his home at No. 20 East Ninety-sixth street last evening and arrested him. He was then arraigned before Magistrate Breen in the Harlem Court, who remanded him to the Coroner.


