

HOLD-UP MAN SENTENCED FOR FIFTEEN YEARS

John Murphy, Bronx Highwayman, Is Adjudged an Habitual Criminal.

John Murphy was sentenced to serve fifteen years in Sing Sing and declared an habitual criminal by Recorder Gott in the Court of General Sessions to-day. This is the third time in the history of the court that a man charged with crime has been declared an habitual criminal, which declaration is virtually a sentence to lifelong police supervision.

Murphy is a hold-up man. On the night of February 18, he stopped a Mr. and Mrs. Cornish at the door of their home, No. 72 East One Hundred and Thirty-eighth street, and attempted to snatch from Mrs. Cornish a \$2,000 brooch.

She resisted and her husband started for the robber, who drew a revolver and fired. A policeman heard the shot and chased Murphy for five blocks. Murphy fired two shots during the pursuit and escaped.

Has Served Six Terms. A few days later he was captured in his flat, right around the corner from the scene of the attempted hold-up. There was a fine line of burglars' tools in the flat and a quantity of dynamite was found stored in the coal-bin in the cellar.

When Murphy was taken to Headquarters he was recognized by the Central Office men as a seasoned crook, who had served six terms in prison. On trial he was positively identified by Mr. and Mrs. Cornish, and his guilt was established without a doubt.

When the man was arraigned for sentence to-day his counsel, George Gordon Battle, made a plea for clemency. He said that Murphy had an incurable disease and would die if confined in prison for any length of time.

An Habitual Criminal. Assistant District Attorney Smyth said that Murphy ought to get the limit. He has been a criminal since boyhood and although still a young man has served four sentences for felonies and two for misdemeanors.

"For the protection of society," said Mr. Smyth, "this man should be sent away for the extreme limit. I ask Your Honor, under the provisions of

Section 60, of the Penal Code, to adjudge him an habitual criminal." Recorder Gott complied with the request. He said he saw no chance of reformation on the part of Murphy and believed it best to put him under supervision for the rest of his life. After he is released from prison Murphy will be compelled to report regularly to the police and will be liable to arrest at any time without a warrant.

POPE RECEIVES MEYER.

Retiring Ambassador Given Audience Before He Leaves Italy.

ROME, March 31.—The Pope to-day received in private audience the retiring Ambassador to Italy, Mr. Meyer and his family. The Pontiff was most affable, showed much satisfaction at meeting Mr. Meyer and expressed great interest in his going to the St. Petersburg post. He said he followed events in Russia with attention and has been in personal correspondence with Emperor Nicholas.

After the audience Mr. and Mrs. Meyer visited Cardinal Merry del Val, the Papal Secretary of State, in the Borgia Apartments, who greeted them most cordially and said he hoped they would return to Rome some time.

POLICE BEAT EGGER'S TO IT IN MAKING A RAID.
