FRIDAY, April 14. What appeared to be a speculative buying sent the price of Northern Securities up to 17 1/2 in the first hour's trading on the curb, and subsequently the quotation advanced to 17 3/4. Heretofore the demand for this stock has mostly come from a single source usually described by the curb brokers as the Hill crowd.

To-day, however, there was a spirited rivalry in the bidding and it is generally believed that the Union Pacific interests were picking up some of this stock. The semi-official report that the Great Northern Railroad is to increase its capital stock with valuable rights to the present stockholders helped to enhance the value of the Northern Securities shares, and Great Northern preferred sold at 21 1/2 when released.
