MANY LIVES IN PERIL AT GREAT EAST SIDE FIRE

Old Ridley Building in Grand Street Destroyed and Department Has a Hard Fight to Save Adjoining Structures—Hundreds in Panic.

Series of Explosions Hurls Masses of Blazing Debris on Dozens of Buildings, Occupants of Which Are Driven to the Street by the Police.

Fire started in the Frank Roesen furniture, carpet and upholstery establishment, which occupies Nos. 317 and 319 Grand street, in the old Ridley five-story building, late to-day and in half an hour the whole building from No. 513 to No. 521, on the corner of Orchard street, was a seething furnace.

The Van Norden Trust Company occupies the ground floor and Frank Roesen the rest of the building. There were 200 to 300 people, employees and customers, in the furniture establishment, and there was considerable panic for the place was all flame in less than five minutes.

Five Alarms Sounded. Patrolman Leonard Hovard, of the Eldridge Street Station, saw the flames belching from the third-story window and sent in an alarm. Five alarms altogether were sounded.

Grand and Orchard streets became crowded by thousands of excited people anxiously inquiring for friends supposed to be in the burning building. The fire extended to all five numbers. The J. C. Cohn dental parlors at No. 512
