

### GATEMEN AND GUARDS GLAD

#### and Subway Employees Pleased by Circulars that After May 1 Their Wages Will Be Increased

The gatemen and guards on the elevated roads and in the subway were made happy to-day by a notice that their wages are to be raised after May 1.

During the big strike the Interborough officials were planning a number of increases, but this was not known to the men. The strike, of course, brought the matter to an end for the time being.

The Interborough service is now thoroughly organized again, and at a recent conference President August Belmont, Vice-President Bryan and General Manager Hadley agreed that it was an opportune time to raise wages. A circular was issued to-day, informing the men of their good luck. It is as follows:

Effective May 1, 1905, the rate of pay of all the first-year gatemen will be increased from \$1.40 to \$1.50 per day.

All first-year guards on the rolls on May 1, 1905, will be advanced to second-year rate, \$1.70 per day.

Men employed as, or promoted to, guard after May 1, 1905, will receive \$1.35 per day as regular first-year guard's rate.

### LAW ADDS TO CITY EXPENSE

#### Increases in Salary List Blamed on Civil Service Rules—Plan for \$10,000 War on Mosquitoes Is Check.

Increases in salaries and the extermination of the mosquito were discussed by the Board of Estimate to-day. Street Cleaning Commissioner Woodbury started by asking for \$7,000 for salary increases in his department.

"Why, you had thirty-four increases last year and a dozen ahead this year," asserted the Mayor, referring to a memorandum.

"Couldn't help it, Mr. Mayor," said the Commissioner. "It's the fault of the Civil Service system. When clerks take an examination for a higher grade and pass, they must get the increased salary. When they pass I promote the men."

"Automatically" asked the Mayor. "No, I do the promoting, but the Civil Service creates the grades."

"I also note that the Bronx has had \$8,000 increase, Brooklyn \$20,000 and Manhattan \$5,000, all for salaries," said the Mayor.

"Yes," spoke up President Hatten of the Bronx, "and we promise to have more. It's the fault of the Civil Service. If you want to keep down the salary list you have to change the Civil Service law."

Commissioner Darlington, of the Health Department asked for \$100,000

more. This included \$10,000 for mosquito extermination on Staten Island. It also provided for thirty-eight "exterminators" to carry on the crude oil experiments.

"Why Newtown Creek has been flooded with oil for fifty years and there isn't a place where you can find more mosquitoes," said President Cassidy. The mosquito appropriation was cut to \$1,000.
