

R. S. PIERREPONT COLUMBIA DONOR

Anonymous Giver of \$500,000 to University for Hamilton Hall Is Member of Wealthy Family and a Sophomore.

Rutherford Stuyvesant Pierrepont, a student of Columbia, who comes up for his degree of Bachelor of Arts with the class of '05 in June, is the donor of the \$500,000 to Columbia University for the building of a college hall.

The young man who has made it possible for Columbia to build a college hall is a resident of Brooklyn, and, as his name indicates, comes of a prominent family. He lives with his family at No. 216 Columbia Heights.

While studying at Columbia he resides at St. Anthony's Hall, One Hundred and Sixteenth Street and Riverside Drive.

His reason for having given the half million dollars anonymously was, according to his chum in college, the fear that the impression might go forth that he was trying to work the institution for a degree.

Pierrepont is one of the crack athletes of Columbia. He wears the university "C" for rowing. He was a member of the freshman eight that beat Yale and set Columbia boys crazy with joy.

Last year he was a member of the varsity "four" and this year he bow out in the first "varsity" eight. In addition to rowing Pierrepont was captain of his class eleven and is considered an all-around man. His brother, Seth Low Pierrepont, is a member of the present sophomore class.
