

PAUL JONES SHOULD REST IN NEW YORK

United Voice of the People of the City Raised to Claim the Body.

MOST FITTING PLACE.

Justice Fitzgerald Gives New Reasons Why This Honor Should Be Paid to Hero.

DISCUSS PLACE OF BURIAL.

Evening World Readers Make Suggestions as to Where Tomb of Admiral Should Be Located.

Irish-Americans throughout New York are enthusiastic in endorsing and promoting The Evening World's plan to bring the body of John Paul Jones to this city for burial.

Supreme Court Justice Fitzgerald, a prominent member of the Clan-na-Gael and other organizations of the sort, said today:

"There can be no question that New York is the most suitable resting place for the remains of Paul Jones. It is a representative harbor port, and was the scene of many of Jones' closest American associations. There is also another phase of the project which should command notice: Ambassador Porter, who discovered John Paul Jones' body, is a New Yorker, and it was largely due to his instrumentalities that the bones of another national hero—Gen. ward having the remains interred in this city. Such a proceeding would seem to indicate the Ambassador's wish that historical honors of the sort be conferred on his native place.

Suggests Liberty Island. The Irish-American Republican League has also unanimously approved The Evening World's suggestion, and adds the opinion that Liberty Island is the most appropriate site for the hero's mausoleum.

The Board of Aldermen have appointed two committees to further the plan, one of which is empowered to cooperate with the various patriotic and historical societies as to the most suitable place in New York City for the interment.

The Legislature has passed unanimously resolutions favoring the scheme

and have arranged that the matter be pressed before the Federal Government. These are but a few of the many important steps in the general movement to bring John Paul Jones' remains to New York. When the claims of the various cities are laid before the Government it will be seen that no other place has so clear a title to the honor as has New York City, where Jones lived, where he wished to pass the remainder of his life and where he received his greatest reward from Congress.

While all New Yorkers are united in the knowledge that this is the only fitting spot for the interment of the Father of the American Navy, yet the President in this city most worthy to receive his remains is not yet determined. Evening World readers are cordially invited to write, through their personal preferences in regard to this matter of exact location.
