

MISTAKE IN USE OF NAME OF A MRS. TEMPLE

An Explanation Due Mrs. Edward Temple, Wife of Hippodrome Stage Director.

The Evening World was informed yesterday that in its report of a petty case in the West Side Police Court last Thursday, May 6, owing to the remarkable similarity in names and professions, Mrs. Edward Temple, wife of the stage manager of the Hippodrome, was confounded with Mrs. Edgar Temple, wife of the former stage manager of "The Girl from Kay's" company.

It was Mrs. Edgar Temple who was summoned to the West Side Court before Magistrate Crane by Mrs. J. E. Hough, who said that in a petty quarrel at the apartment-house in which they both live, No. 249 West One Hundred and Ninth street, Mrs. Edgar Temple struck her. There had been a long-standing quarrel between the two women. Magistrate Crane, after admonishing them, fined Mrs. Edgar Temple \$5 as the Evening World stated.

The only error in the report was in describing the defendant in the police court as the wife of the "former stage manager of 'The Girl from Kay's' company and now stage manager of the Hippodrome." The two Mrs. Temples are in no way related or even known to each other.

Edward Temple, the manager of the Hippodrome, and his wife were, therefore, not in any way connected with the quarrel. The difficulty which brought the other stage manager's wife, Mrs. Temple, before Magistrate Crane, the defendant, Mrs. Temple, whose husband was stage manager of "The Girl from Kay's" a thousand or more years ago, occurred at No. 122 West One Hundred and Ninth street, where the quarrel occurred.

Edward Temple, the manager of the Hippodrome, lives at No. 122 West One Hundred and Ninth street, with Mrs. Temple, where both are in the highest esteem socially and professionally. Mr. Temple, now of the Hippodrome, was stage manager for Klaw & Erlanger for five years, and directed many of their most important productions. Prior to that he staged the most important productions of Henry W. Savage for three years, and still stands in the rank of his profession as a man and a manager.

DUGRO FAVORS U. S. DIVORCES

Justice Declares, in Adjudging Illinois Decree Invalid in This State, Federal Courts Should Settle Matrimonial Tangles.

"I would rather decide the other way, because this is a case where the wife wanted a divorce, and the husband was apparently willing that she should have one. It seems to me the law should be changed, giving the United States Courts jurisdiction in matrimonial cases, so a divorce could be granted that would be good all over the world. It would not do to change the law so that a divorce could be granted in our State against a defendant living in another, because if that were so a husband could go out from New York to the State of Washington and sue the wife he left in New York and compel her to travel to Puget Sound in order to defend herself. But if the Federal Courts were given divorce power a case brought in Washington against a New York defendant could be transferred to New York, or to some fair middle ground.

"I must rule that this decree obtained by Mrs. Mabel Raum Littell against Joseph Reed Littell in Illinois, in good faith, is invalid in this State, inasmuch as Littell lived here, never lived in Illinois, and that therefore the Illinois Courts never had jurisdiction. It follows, then, that a decree must be granted, that a divorce must be granted, annulling the marriage of Mr. Littell."

In these words Justice Dugro, of the Supreme Court, decided the case of Mrs. Raum Littell, prima donna, against Joseph Reed Littell, the famous patent lawyer to whom she was married after his first wife, who was a daughter of Gen. Green G. Raum, of Chicago, secured a Chicago divorce from him and the custody of their two children, in 1890.

Mrs. Raum did not appear in court. The only witnesses were Mr. Littell and the first Mrs. Littell. Mr. Littell testified that he was married to Mrs. Raum; that she divorced him, and that she then married Miss Raum in good faith.

Mr. Littell and his wife who divorced him, and who is now clerk in one of the departments of the State, were on friendly terms, and chatted pleasantly after the trial.

JILTED YOUTH CUTS THROAT

Mrs. McBride, hearing his groans, forced open the door of his room, found him stretched on the floor and his entire body covered with blood. The youth was taken to the Presbyterian Hospital in a dying condition.
