

DIVORCE FOR "AL" ADAMS' DAUGHTER

Mrs. Robert Lee Armit Obtains a Decree at Newport on Grounds of Continued Drunkenness—Husband Wealthy.

(Special to The Evening World.) NEWPORT, May 25.—Judge Blodgett to-day granted Mrs. Robert Lee Armit, the daughter of "Al" Adams, policy king, a decree of divorce on grounds of continued drunkenness. There was no contest or sensational development, but the case attracted much attention on account of the young woman whose loyalty to her father when he was sent to State prison for running the nearest game in the world was never abated.

All the money that Adams lavished on his children brought little social happiness to Mrs. Armit, formerly Evelyn Adams. She was a very attractive girl and received a thorough education at Wellesley and afterward abroad, where she studied music with her sister Ida. After her marriage when she bought a cottage at Newport, she was admitted to a few houses of social prominence, but on account of her father's reputation the great majority of people did not take to the pretty girl.
