

WALL STREET

TUESDAY, June 13

President Roosevelt's letter to Thomas F. Ryan accepting the Equitable trusteeship had the effect of a tonic in Wall street. While awaiting the action of the courts in the case of broker Hatch, who violated the new stock transfer tax law in order to test its constitutionality, the room traders on the Stock Exchange have resumed operations. They are perhaps more cautious than formerly in taking chances, but most of them have become imbued with some of the courage of broker Hatch, who believes that he is going to win his suit. It is worthy of note that while the transfer tax stamps are affixed to each 100 shares of stock sold, this tax is being paid under protest and the traders who pay the tax are assured that they stand a good chance of getting their money back. The men who are actively fighting this stock transfer tax assert that the reason why there has not been more of a growl from Wall street over it is because of the abnormal dullness of the stock market since the new law took effect.

With the exception of Atchison all of the active American stocks were freely sold by London early in the day, causing a slight shrinkage in the first quotations. Wall street estimates of the aggregate amount of stocks sold by London houses here within the first fifteen minutes places the figure at \$6,000,000. The London market was reported to be depressed because of lack of confidence in Russia's sincerity in the matter of peace negotiations. A spirited rally in London helped the entire market to recover gradually. The Wormers led the buying of Atchison and bid in several large blocks of this stock. For awhile some of the leading professionals worked hand in hand in an endeavor to steady a wobbly market movement, but there was no evidence that outsiders were taking any interest in the movement. London bought some stocks and helped along an advance in Canadian Pacific.

The prominent absence from the street of the usually active and aggressive Western speculative element has caused much distress to the rank and file of stock brokers who miss the fat commissions that they about whenever this keener Western element is present. Inquiry among some of the New York houses representing Western speculative interests elicits the information that the leading operators in the West sold out their holdings of stocks when prices were at their highest two months ago. These Western operators are now giving their entire attention to watching the crops and studying the market. They will be ready, their New York representatives say, to jump in and buy stocks at the first indication of a permanent upward movement. When the proper time comes the St. Paul and the Rock Island are the favorites who will resume operations on a large scale. The total sales of stocks yesterday were \$1,900,000 and of bonds \$3,490,000.
