

FINDS BROTHER IN AMBULANCE

Surgeon About to Apply Artificial Respiration to Man Nearly Drowned Discovers Victim Is His Relative.

Under the careful attention of his brother, a physician at the Norwegian Hospital, Brooklyn, Harry Livingston, of No. 211 Eighteenth street, Brooklyn, is recovering to-day, he having been nearly drowned in the presence of a large crowd of bathers yesterday afternoon at Bensonhurst.

Livingston was swimming far from shore when his strength gave out and with a yell for help, he sank. Edward Giblin, a fireman attached to Engine Company No. 143, at Bath Beach, went to Livingston's aid, and, after diving several times, he came to the surface with him.

The tide was running out, and for twenty minutes Giblin battled in the water, all the time keeping Livingston's head above water. When he got the unconscious man ashore he was cheered loudly.

When the ambulance came from the Norwegian Hospital the surgeon sprang out and, running to the insensible man, began to apply artificial respiration, when he suddenly cried out:

"Why, this is my brother!" Dr. Livingston then hurried his brother to the hospital.
