'GET-RICH-QUICK' FRAUDS CHARGED

Trial of Stanley Francis, Accused of Being the Leader of a Big Swindling Gang in Philadelphia.

PHILADELPHIA, Oct. 9.—Stanley Francis, alias Arthur S. Foster, alias Arthur S. Foster-Francis, &c., was today placed on trial before Judge John J. in the United States District Court, charged with having used the mails to defraud, in connection with "get-rich-quick" enterprises.

The specific charges against Foster are that he was the principal in the Storey Cotton Company, which is alleged to have defrauded a large number of persons throughout the country, and that he was also connected with the Provident Investment Bureau.


