

PRESIDENT AIDS, PARTY ENDS TEACHER WINS

Miss Overton Secures Place in Philippines When Roosevelt Joins in Her Fight for Appointment.

Miss Marie B. Overton, an attractive young woman, teaches school at Richmond Hill, L. I. Patriotic and adventurous, she determined to teach the budding Americans in the Philippines. In September, 1904, she entered an examination for a position as teacher there. Of 200 competitors Miss Overton passed sixteenth with an average of 88.8. Then she patiently waited for her appointment. It did not come, and when her fighting blood was fired by learning that some of her competitors, whose averages were lower, had been appointed over her fair head.

It happens that President Roosevelt knows about the Overton family. The schoolmaster's father, Winfield Scott Overton, a Brooklyn lawyer, fought in the civil war. Her brother, Capt. Winfield Scott Overton, M. C. & A., has fought well in the Philippines. Her father wrote the facts told here to Congressman W. W. Cook, of Westbury, L. I., and asked him to request the President to appoint Miss Overton to a square deal. "The Congressman went to the President about it. "Cable immediately to Manila and learn why Miss Overton's appointment has been held up," Mr. Roosevelt ordered.

LOUDLY PROTEST WOMEN'S NAMES

Mrs. Earle Declares She Never Heard of Those Who Are to Be Honored in the Hall of Fame.

While the names of famous men selected by the committee two days ago to adorn the niches in the Hall of Fame have been received without any loud protest, the names of the three women who are to have the honor have called forth the most dissatisfaction on the part of Mrs. Frederick P. Earle, former Regent of the Daughters of the Revolution.

Who was Mary Lyon and who was Maria Mitchell is what is being asked. Why not Mary Washington, mother of the father of our country, given this honor? "I never heard of Mary Lyon before, and the name of Maria Mitchell is entirely unfamiliar to me," said Mrs. Earle. "Why have they been selected for such honor and the names of Mary and Martha Washington excluded? Is there any woman in American history better entitled to live in the memory of our people than Martha Washington?"
