10,811,000,000 CIGARETTES A YEAR

WASHINGTON, Dec. 4.—In his annual report, John W. Yerkes, Commissioner of Internal Revenue, reports that the cigarette manufacture in the United States in the fiscal year ending June 30 last numbered 10,811,000,000. The quantity of tobacco manufactured is given as follows: Plug, 186,270,270 pounds; twist, 2,782,211; fine cut chewing, 12,197,000; smoking, 146,151,690. The Commissioner estimates that the receipts from all internal revenue sources for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1906, will aggregate \$242,000,000, nearly \$8,000,000 in excess of those for the last fiscal year. When there was collected on distilled spirits \$129,512,629; on fermented liquors, \$49,469,639; and on tobacco, \$46,669,910. The leading States in the payment of
