UNION FINED \$1,000, JAIL FOR PRINTERS

Chicago Judge Declares Organization and Two Members in Contempt.

CHICAGO, Jan. 29.—President Edwin R. Wright, of Typographical Union No. 16, was to-day fined by Judge Holdom, of the Supreme Court, \$100 and sentenced to thirty days in jail for contempt of court.

The charge against the organization and its members who were fined by Judge Holdom was violation of an injunction granted some weeks ago by which the members of the union were enjoined from interfering in any manner with the operation of the printing establishments operated by members of the Chicago Typothetae, and from interfering in any manner with the non-union workmen employed in these establishments.

Before the announcement of the decision counsel for the union asked leave to file an affidavit signed by sixty members of the union, which stated that they were opposed to violence in any form in connection with the strike.




