

PROFESSOR AT COLOMBIA'S FEELED IN AUTO

John D. Prince Attacked as He Sits in His Machine Near Broadway.

STRUCK WITH A BOTTLE.

Declares He Was Assaulted by Edward C. Griffiths, Proprietor of Arcade Garage.

Detectives are to-day looking for Edward C. Griffiths, proprietor of the Arcade garage, at Broadway and Forty-ninth street.

While Prince was sitting in an automobile late last night, in Forty-ninth street, Men of the Detective Bureau struck him a blow on the side of the head with a heavy bottle, which the professor thinks contained acid.

Police are unable to find Griffiths today either at his home or his place of business.

Tried to Make a Mystery.

The Police Department was inclined to make very much of a mystery of the attack, but the Detective Bureau tried hard to keep the story a secret.

It was just after midnight when Prof. Prince, driving from a deep cut in his face and weak from pain and shock, was helped into the West Forty-seventh Street station.

After making the complaint, Prof. Prince went home, where he has been confined to his bed. He has been attended by a doctor who has prescribed a course of treatment.

Has Many Wounds on Face.

A reporter for The Evening World learned of the assault this afternoon. He went to the home of the professor, who lives at 100 West 47th street.

When he learned that his caller was a newspaper man, he said he had no more to say.

His assailant fled.

He was wrapped up in a heavy fur coat and could not defend himself.

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
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MERCURY TUMBLES TOWARD ZERO—5 ABOVE TONIGHT

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FIFTY GIRLS TRIED TO LEAP FROM FIRE

Prevented by Police from Jumping Off Roof and Led to Safety.

Fifty panic-stricken girls on the roof of the five-story building at No. 52 West Broadway were prevented from throwing themselves to the street late this afternoon only by the prompt action of reserves from the Mercer street station.

The policemen forced their way through the smoke-filled, blazing hall to the roof and led or forced the hysterical women to the roof of the adjoining building at No. 54.

The fire started in the rear of the second floor of No. 52. This and the third floor are occupied by the New York Cap Company, where twenty girls are employed. The floors above are used by the Paradise & Jacobs Paper Box Company, where thirty girls work.
