

BOY SHOT AT GIRL, KILLED HIMSELF

Locket Stopped Bullet and Saved Life of Intended Victim.

BOSTON, May 18.—George H. De Wolf, Jr., eighteen years old, of No. 212 Hamilton street, Cambridge, shot Lillian Parks, otherwise known as Lillian Thorgood, aged seventeen, of No. 213 Cambridge street, Allston, early today, on the street in Cambridgeport. The girl escaped injury through the fact that the bullet from De Wolf's revolver struck a locket attached to a chain about her neck. De Wolf immediately after firing at the girl shot himself in the head. He died in the Cambridge Hospital. The youth had been paying attention to the girl for some time. With Harry King, John McGinn, Celia Dwoley and her sister, Annie, De Wolf and Miss Parks attended a dance in Central Square last night. There De Wolf and the girl had a quarrel, which resulted in his leaving the hall. According to his father, young De Wolf got home at 10 o'clock and left the house soon afterward.

SAVED VICTIM OF BENZINE FLAMES

Armof and Dishpan Used by Rescuer to Drag Hurt Man Out.

Two men were burned last night as the result of an explosion in the tailor shop at No. 303 Bridge street, Brooklyn. They were hurried to the Brooklyn Hospital. They are Jacob Joseph, thirty-eight years old, and Henry Steuben, fifty. Joseph runs the shop and Steuben is his helper. Steuben was cleaning clothes with benzine and Joseph's wife was ironing in the rear room. Joseph had just gone to the street when the explosion happened. Dense smoke soon filled the store and hallway. Joseph found his wife and Steuben on the floor and the shop on fire. Seizing his wife he dragged her to a rear door and into the yard. Then he ran back for Steuben, who was surrounded by flames. Joseph tore an antique suit of armor from the wall and setting a dishpan held them in front of him and crept toward the prostrate man. The shop was like a furnace by this time and Joseph had a perilous time reaching his helper. The armor plate and the dishpan did good service, and he caught Steuben's clothing and dragged him from the flames. Philip Hennessy, who was asleep on

the second floor, was thrown out of bed by the force of the explosion. Clad in his undergarments he groped through the smoke-filled hallway. When he reached the ground floor he heard cries for help and he assisted Joseph in getting the unconscious Steuben to the back yard. Both were burned, but Joseph was the greater sufferer, as he was surrounded by flames while rescuing his wife and Steuben. When the engines arrived the flames had reached the second floor. The damage is put at \$3,000. Ambulance Surgeon Wooding attended to the two tailors, Hennessy and Mrs. Joseph.


