Flames Sweep Through Great West Side

Factories So Swiftly that Employees Have Narrow Escape from Death—Several Injured.

CARRIED DOWN LADDERS BY POLICE AND FIREMEN.

Blaze Starts in Chemical Factory, and Spreads With Great Rapidity—Two Men Sent Dying to Hospital—150 Reserves Keep Crowd Back.

A five-alarm fire that covered the entire block between Twenty-fifth and Twenty-fourth streets and Tenth and Eleventh avenues late this afternoon threatened the west side manufacturing district and caused injuries to scores of persons.

Two of them may die, and three ambulances were kept busy carrying the victims away. Four firemen were crushed by a falling wall and badly hurt.

More than a thousand girls were employed in the buildings which were swept by flames. Many of the women were cut off from escape and were carried down ladders by firemen and policemen.

Explosion Starts Blaze. The fire started from a slight explosion on the south side of the second story of the factory of the Zucker, Levitt & Loel Company.

Whole Block in Flames. These brought to the scene twenty-three engines, two fire boats, one of which was brought over from Brooklyn.
