

Anarchists Hurl Deadly Missile at Grand Duke Vladimir of Russia, as He Follows Alfonso and His Bride After Ceremony.

ROYAL COUPLE NOT HURT AND SHOW NO FEAR IN PANIC

Czar's Envoy Escapes in the Explosion, but Soldiers and Guards Near Him Meet Death—Five Arrests Were Made, While the Assassin Gets Away.

MADRID, May 31.—A bomb was thrown into the bridal procession of King Alfonso and his Queen this afternoon as the royal pair were returning with their escort from the church of St. Geronimo to the Royal Palace.

Neither the King nor Queen nor any of the guests were injured, but a number of soldiers, guards and horses in the escort were killed.

The arrest of five of a group of Anarchists from which the bomb was thrown developed that they intended to kill Grand Duke Vladimir, of Russia, who was one of the guests, and was riding in the bridal procession.

Several of them, including the man who threw the bomb, escaped in the confusion following the explosion of the bomb.

The noise was terrific and the destruction widespread. The bomb-throwing created the wildest excitement and caused a panic in which many were injured.

A report spread that the King and Queen had been killed. This aroused mad indignation. The soldiers had great difficulty in getting the prisoners out of the crowds.

The bomb was thrown from the balcony of a house in the Calle Mayor. Aside from those killed, at least thirty were wounded. Some of the
