

PLUCKY WOMAN  
SUBDUES THIEF  
WITH HATPIN

Burglar Had Stunned Her  
Husband with His  
Jimmy.

THEN SHE TOOK A HAND.  
Mrs. Benach Thinks Her Brave  
Feat Is Not Worth Dis-  
cussing.

When a man who said he was Joseph Miller, of No. 248 Second avenue, but who, according to the police, has been known as Felix Gross, a burglar, was arraigned in Harlem Police Court to-day the principal witness against him was Mrs. Morris Benach, a pretty young woman who captured him in her apartments yesterday afternoon after he had beaten her husband down, jabbing a long hatpin into his flesh and holding him by the hair, she had held this man until the police came.

"It was nothing," she commented as she turned to testify against the accused burglar.

The Benachs live with their children in apartments at No. 25 West One Hundred and Sixteenth street. The father and mother took the children, Henry and Ruth, and a cousin, Miss Fannie Rudnick, to the park yesterday afternoon. They returned sooner than they had expected to find a burglar in the house.

As Benach entered the intruder made for him with a jimmy and sent him reeling to the hallway. The burglar then leaped down the stairs. The children stood in his way and he knocked them down with his hand. As he passed the children Benach grappled with him and the two men rolled about the floor. At the same time Mrs. Rudnick closed the apartment-house door and held it.

Benach was no match for the burglar. The latter fought like one trained to wrestle and box. He was soon on top of Benach, holding him down. Then it was that Mrs. Benach joined in the fight. She fastened one hand in the man's hair and with the other she plunged a hatpin so deep into his flesh that he writhed and screamed.

When Police-man Fox came he and the burglar had a hand-to-hand tussle. The policeman overpowered the man and shackled his wrists. Then he started up Fifth avenue with his prisoner.

At One Hundred and Seventeenth street Miller wrenched free and ran up the avenue. Pushing pedestrians aside as he ran and striking them with his manacled hands he darted in a nd out among carriages and automobiles until he reached One Hundred and Nineteenth street. There he was overtaken by the policeman and clubbed into submission.

Benach says that the burglar had packed up \$5,000 worth of jewelry, silverware and cut glass ready to remove from his home.

POLICE RESERVES  
AS VACCINATORS

Called to San Juan Hill Negro  
District in Small  
Case.

The police of the West Sixty-eighth street station had a job on their hands early to-day. The Health Department asked them to help control a hundred or more negroes living in the tenement-house at No. 314 West Sixty-first street that it might be vacated. The house is in the heart of San Juan Hill, always a terror to the police. Several race riots have centered about the place.

Lillian Brooks, twenty-four years old, living in the house, was taken ill yesterday. Dr. Shanley, of the neighborhood, was called, and he notified the Health Department. The Brooks woman was removed to the Willard Parker Hospital. The doctors agreed that she had viral small-pox.

Two of the physicians of the Health Department were ordered to go to the house and vaccinate everybody in it—men, women and children. A white-haired old negro met them defiantly at the door brandishing a broom and daring them to enter. She was quickly reinforced by the men in the house and the physicians left to save their skins.

They hastened to the station and got several policemen who stormed the place and guarded all exits while the physicians vaccinated the remaining vaccine virus into the unwilling arms. A servant at the police station said that thirty-three cases of small-pox had come out of San Juan Hill within sixty days.
