Prof. Edlemann Held at Ellis Island Says He Is Worth \$200,000 and Appeals to Washington.

Prof. Albert Edlemann, a British subject, sixty-six years old, and full of reminiscences of a life of world wandering.

Dr. Edlemann said to-day that he has been professor of botany, chemistry and medicine and that he was one of the Royal Commission sent from England eight years ago to investigate the cause of the bubonic plague in India.

"I ought to be admitted here because I was a friend of Abraham Lincoln and loved him \$50,000 for the navy during the civil war."

The old man tells many stories of his past. He said that two of his daughters and his son were drowned in the Galveston flood. He has a letter from Sir Percy Sanderson, the British Consul here, telling him to wait in patience until his appeal shall be considered.
