TO EVICT MRS. STENTON FROM HER BRONX HOME

Disposes Notice Put Up by Lawyer Gibson on House When Aged Woman's Daughter Was Slain.

Burton W. Gibson, the attorney who has figured so prominently in the Bronx murder mystery, to-day had a city marshal take a dispossession notice on the front door of the old Stenton mansion. The notice, which was in the regular legal form, was signed "Arthur J. Laid J. McFarland, landlord, Burton W. Gibson, agent."

Row with Stenographer. Mr. Gibson said he had ordered Coroner McDonald's stenographer, Hamberger, out of his office early in the day. "He brought me the typewritten minutes of my testimony," said Mr. Gibson, "and demanded \$100. I refused to pay any such hold-up price, and he said I must remember that I was in a very peculiar situation before the public. I made it plain at once to the stenographer that my position is subject neither to blackmail, and told him to repeat all I had said to the coroner. He accepted a check for \$45 for his minutes before he left."
